One-Year timeout Education Use Only Software to be used free of charge *on student owned computers*.

ESRI Support has worked on the web forms for ordering and registering the free student software and all should be well this year.

*****Important Note:** Make sure to tell your students to read the FAQs about how to register their free software when they load it on their Student Owned Computers. If they have trouble, please contact me and I will contact our ESRI Student Software people to see if there are any issues this year with the registration site. They were a little overwhelmed in the past when they started receiving calls from students in all of our region states.

In the past the site would deny registration:(

- (a) If the students used "student" anywhere on the form.
- (b) If they used any acronyms such as USU instead of Utah State University.
- (c) If their computer name did not match the user name they setup on the site.
